- ESWET Panel discussion: waste to energy the beauty and the beast

Ongoing Surveys and Consultations

- Amendment to Annex IV and V POP Regulation:
 - The Commission has opened for feedback a <u>Proposal for a</u> <u>Regulation amending Annexes IV and V to Regulation</u> (<u>EU</u>) 2019/1021 of the <u>European Parliament and of the</u> <u>Council on persistent organic pollutants</u>.
 - Please provide us with your feedback until 3rd December 2021.
- <u>Target Revision of the Regulation on CLP</u>
 - The Commission opened a Public Consultation on the Targeted Revision of the Regulation on Classification, Labelling and Packaging of Substances and Mixtures (CLP) (here).

 FEAD prepared a <u>draft response</u> and sent it to members and extended the deadline for feedback. Please provide us with <u>your feedbacks</u> by the 5th of November.

General Block Exemption Regulation (GBER):

- 6th October, the Commission has opened the public consultation on the <u>draft General Block Exemption</u> <u>Regulation (GBER)</u>.
- It widens up the scope of existing provisions on aid for recycling and reutilisation of waste, by also covering investment aid for other investments that aim at increasing the level of resource efficiency or contributing to the transition towards a circular economy.
- FEAD has prepared a <u>draft response</u> and sent it to members. Please provide us with your feedbacks by the 15th of November.

• FEAD provided feedback to consultations:

- 26th October 2021: FEAD provided a <u>reply</u> to the survey on the End of Life Vehicles Directive revision and <u>responses to</u> <u>the questionnaire</u>.
- 27th October 2021: FEAD provided <u>feedback to the</u>
 <u>roadmap for the policy framework on biobased</u>,
 <u>biodegradable</u>, and <u>compostable plastics</u>.

FEAD attended the Ad-hoc meeting of the CAs for the REACH (Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemicals) and CLP (Classification, Labelling and Packaging) Regulations (CARACAL) on Annex VIII and Online Sales, on the 27th of October 2021.

Monitoring of EU Institutions

<u>Life of EU institutions</u>

• Bio-based and Biodegradable or Compostable Plastics:

 27th October 2021: The Commissions public consultation on the roadmap on stablishing a policy framework bio-based plastics and biodegradable or compostable plastics closed.

Sustainable product initiative:

 27th October 2021: Sustainable product initiative postponed to beginning 2022. Under discussion are especially specific criteria to be set product by product or the introduction of a digital product passport.

• End-of-Life Vehicles & 3R Type-Approval:

- 27th October 2021: The public consultation on the revision of the Directive 2000/53/EC and Directive 2005/64/EC closed on the 26th of October. Based on the feedback, the Commission will finalise its proposal.
- Stakeholder workshops are expected at the end of 2021.

• Monitoring Framework for A Circular Economy II:

 26th October 2021: The <u>minutes</u> of the Expert Group meeting on Sustainable Consumption and Production, held on 17 June 2021 and the <u>presentation</u> of the revised Monitoring Framework for a Circular Economy has been made available. A Communication with revised and new indicators for the Framework is expected by the end of 2021.

• Single Use Plastics (Separate Collection Targets):

25th October 2021: EU rules (<u>Commission Implementing</u>
 <u>Decision (EU) 2021/1752</u>) on the calculation, verification
 and reporting of data on the collection of single-use plastic
 beverage bottles entered into force.

• Waste Framework Directive:

 22nd October 2021: The Commission is expected to come forward with a proposal for a Directive revising, during the second quarter 2023. A 4-week public consultation on the roadmap and a 12-week public consultation is expected to be launched during the first half of 2022.

• methane-Strategy:

 21st October 2021: The Parliament adopted a report on the methane-strategy. Devoted to methane emissions, among other things, from the waste sectors, the resolution lists measures expected by MEPs in the forthcoming revision of the waste (2023) and landfill (2024) directives.

• green state aid:

 21st October 2021: MEPs adopted a <u>text</u> expressing the Parliament's position on the revision of the rules governing state aid in the environmental and climate change fields.

Batteries Regulation:

 Renew and the Greens tabled more than 1250 amendments to ENVI's draft report on the batteries regulation – and other Groups did as well. The amendments are not available yet.

DG ENVI:

 Reorganisation at the European Commission's DG Environment - The aim of this restructuring is to adapt the work of DG ENVI to the priorities of the Green Deal (circular economy, biodiversity and the fight against pollution). The new organisation chart will be in force from 1 January, after adoption by the College of Commissioners.

Press Review & Reports

25th October: The European Environmental Bureau published a
policy brief on prohibiting the destruction of Unsold goods which
includes a list of measures it hopes will be included in the future
Sustainable Products Initiative. It calls for the introduction of a
legally binding "duty of care" for producers and retailers from

2022. And a ban on the destruction or disposal of unsold goods from 2023, both for new products and those returned by consumers. Read the full policy brief **here**.
